Hiko 418 is a rare recessive free specimen with TF151 and TF148 in succession in her pedigree as her maternal grandsire and great grandsire. She is a herd foundation cow with an inbreeding COI of 2%, making her open to a tremendous variety of sire selections. Her low COI%, free of all known defects by test and a phenomenal sire stack make her a great investment.

The Hikokura maternal line is one of the sought after maternal lines in the Wagyu Breed. This line has produced some of the breeds biggest sires, TF Itomichi 1/2, TF Teruntani 40/1, TF 149 Mitsuhiokura and the recent Australian sensation Mayura Itoshigenami Jr.

The demand for exceptional females with no defects from the Hikokura line by knowing breeders puts these rare pedigrees in demand, Hiko 418's full sister (Hikokura 15) sold last April at the Synergy Sale as the sale topper for \$56,000. At that time reported to be the third highest price ever paid for a Fullblood Wagyu female in the states at public auction.
